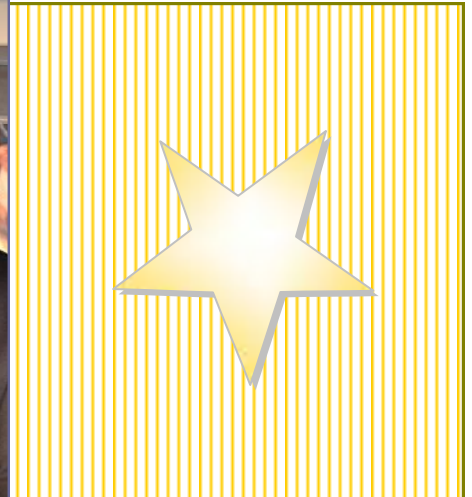
HISTORIC LEGEND



Jackie Clark was a Camperdown boy who won an Austral in 1904 then the New York Six in 1909 and 1911, also the Berlin Six. His career of achievements including world Records now see him inducted into the new Victorian Cycling Historic Legends Category.
